

INTRODUCTION

The University of KwaZulu-Natal was formed on 1 January 2004 as a result of a merger between the former Universities of Durban-Westville and Natal. The new institution brings together the academic expertise and research capacity of two major regional universities and is at the forefront of higher educational transformation in South Africa.

The University is home to the region's leading academics and has among its staff an impressive number of internationally acclaimed scientists and researchers, as rated by the National Research Foundation. The full spectrum of research is supported, from curiosity-driven to application-based and participatory action research with community partners. Research is conducted by, and in association with, members of the academic staff, associated research units, industry, business, government, local communities and international institutions and agencies.

The University has adopted a vision to be the "Premier University of African Scholarship". It strives to reflect the society in which it is situated, not only in terms of race, gender and class, but in how it structures its values and priorities and how it responds, through its research, to social needs. KwaZulu-Natal provides fertile soil for researchers and the University's mission commits the institution to critical engagement with its society and encourages practical research that will improve people's lives. This outcomes-driven approach has led to the establishment of inter-disciplinary "centres of excellence" devoted to particular projects and often involving collaboration with institutions from around the world.

The University has formal and informal ties, as well as established exchange programmes, with more than 260 leading universities around the world. At present one-third of total student registrations are in postgraduate studies. The Research Office, headed by the Deputy Vice-

Chancellor Research, Knowledge Production and Partnerships, is responsible for the management and nurturing of research and places strong emphasis on team research. The Office also assists staff and postgraduate students with grant applications, contracts, intellectual property rights and related administrative matters.

Senior academics take pride in the mentorship provided to graduate students, encouraging them to develop their skills in critical appraisal and independent thought.

The University provides a vibrant environment for basic, applied and medical research and offers internationally recognised postgraduate research degrees in all disciplines. It has fostered strategic initiatives in the areas of HIV/Aids, Conservation, Economic Development and Water.

Research innovation is a cornerstone of the new University and as an institution of higher learning, research excellence is recognised and supported as part of its essential identity. The University is committed to growing its existing research capacity further and leading the bid to bring South African and African scholarship to the attention of the international community. At the same time, we recognise that excellence in research and knowledge production should lead to practical interventions in national development strategies, and should be directed to the upliftment of poor and under-developed communities.

Postgraduate students at the University have the opportunity to contribute towards these interventions. We believe that the strategic priorities outlined above respond to both national and international needs and opportunities and provide considerable scope for cutting-edge research. We look forward to bringing future postgraduate students on board.

Choice of Campuses

From the mountain vistas of the Drakensberg to the wild reaches of Maputaland, KwaZulu-Natal is a province of contrasts. The University of KwaZulu-Natal offers prospective students the choice of five campuses, each with its own distinctive character.

Edgewood (Pinetown)

Formerly the Edgewood College of Education before its incorporation in 2001, the Edgewood campus in Pinetown is the University's primary site for teacher education. Situated in Pinetown with easy access to the N3 highway and approximately 20 minutes' drive from Durban, the campus offers sophisticated and attractive facilities to a growing number of Education students. Education provides initial and in-service teacher education and offers university higher degrees in a wide range of specialisms in education as well as carrying out research and consultancy. Faculty staff members are actively engaged with

policy-making in education in South Africa and contribute to the international profile of the University through participation in international conferences, teaching international students, hosting international visitors and publishing in international books and journals.

Howard College (Durban)

Durban is a vibrant coastal city renowned for its beaches and coastal resorts. The city is also a major South African port. The magnificent game reserves and estuaries of Maputaland, north of Durban, are a favourite getaway for staff and students alike. Opened in 1931 follow-

ing a generous donation by Mr T B Davis, whose son Howard Davis was killed during the Battle of Somme in World War I, the Howard College campus is situated on the Berea and offers spectacular views of the Durban harbour. The campus is situated in a successful environmental conservancy and the lush gardens of the University reflect a commitment to indigenous flora and fauna. The Howard College Campus currently offers a range of postgraduate qualification options in the fields of Science, Engineering, Law, Humanities, Development and Social Sciences (including Music, Social Work, Housing, Architecture and Nursing).

Nelson R Mandela School of Medicine (Durban)

Medical School has been producing quality doctors for 56 years. Founded in 1950 as a “black faculty” in a “white institution”, for most of its history, the School has been synonymous with the struggle for democracy

and racial equality. On its 50th anniversary in 2000, the Medical School received the finest birthday present it could have wished for – the agreement of former president and Nobel Peace Prize winner, Nelson Mandela, to link his name to the school. The campus is also home to the Doris Duke Medical Research Institute which was launched in July 2003, and which is training a generation of clinical researchers, enhancing the clinical research infrastructure in KwaZulu-Natal, and fostering collaborations between research groups working on similar projects in South Africa and other countries.



Pietermaritzburg

Pietermaritzburg is located in the centre of the scenic Natal Midlands, close to nu-


GENERAL INFORMATION

merous nature reserves and parks, only one hour's drive from Durban and two hours' drive from the Drakensberg. The city has a rich architectural heritage, with many fine examples of Victorian and Edwardian buildings. The city is the birthplace of the former University of Natal and its forerunner, the Natal University College, which opened its doors to 57 students in 1910. Two years later, Old Main Building was completed and the hub of the present-day PMB campus was established. The campus offers a wide range of innovative academic programmes, which have been successful in responding to local and pro-

vincial needs in the broad areas of Science and Agriculture, Education, Law, Human and Management Sciences. Unique to the Pietermaritzburg campus are the disciplines of Agriculture, Theology and Fine Art.

Westville (Durban)

Located within an environmental conservancy about 8 kilometres from the CBD of Durban eight Pinetown, the Westville campus combines state of the art infrastructure with beautiful natural surroundings. The campus's Hindu temple and an Islamic place of worship reflect its rich multicultural history. It is also the official address of the University of KwaZulu-Natal, housing the Vice-Chancellor's office, the offices of Executive members and University-wide administrative divisions. The campus currently offers postgraduate programmes in Science, Engineering, Law, Management, and Health Sciences.

Entrance Procedures

Selection Procedure

The selection of students for postgraduate study is at the discretion of the Head of School, who will require a particular standard of previous attainment. An applicant may contact the School concerned for more information.

Application Procedure

While actual selection is carried out by Schools, administrative application is a vital part of the procedure which must be followed. All applicants for postgraduate study must complete an 'Application for Admission to Study' form, which is available from the Applications/Faculty Office, pay the required application fee and be issued with a student number.

This procedure will ensure that your application is entered on the data base and if selected, that a registration form is generated. In addition many Schools have their own internal application forms, and other forms that they require to be completed.

A non-refundable application fee is payable on submission of the application form. Refer below for information on application fees and to the listing on pages 19 – 33 for information on closing dates.

Fees Payable

For fee structure refer to: www.ukzn.ac.za/prospective/pdf/ukznIntfees2006pdf. Please note that fees quoted were for 2006. Please allow for an increase of at least 5% for 2008. Students from SADC and other African countries will pay the same fees as South African students but will pay an additional levy of R700 per semester (R1 400 per annum).

The fees for postgraduate courses fluctuate depending on the qualification, the academic year, and whether the qualification is taken on a full-time or part-time basis. The full fee structure for South African and SADC students can be found on www.ukzn.ac.za/prospective/pdf/ukzn-fees2006pdf but a few examples are given below to explain the structure. E.g.:

Postgraduate Diploma in Education:

1 year full-time	–	R8 920 p.a.
2 years part-time	–	R4 250 p.a. plus levy if applicable

Masters (Arts, Accounting) (Dissertation/Thesis):

- 1 year full-time – R10 350 p.a.
- 2 years part-time – R6 230 p.a.
- Subsequent years – R2 000 p.a. plus
levy if applicable

PhD in Science:

- Year 1 – R14 900 p.a.
- Subsequent years – R2 000 p.a. plus
levy if applicable

It should be noted that the academic fees provided are for the 2008 academic year and applicants for 2009 should allow for an increase in fees. The academic fee does not include any accommodation fees and applicants must consult the web page information on accommodation and subsistence fees recommended.

Students from countries outside Africa

Tuition Fees Coursework: (Fees may change for 2009)

All students enrolling for Postgraduate Diplomas, Honours or Coursework Masters degrees will pay a tuition fee of:

- (i) Full time (one year) –
US\$6 000 per annum
- (ii) Part time (two or more years) –
US\$3 000 per annum.

These fees are inclusive of the international levy.

Please note that the above US\$6 000 (full time) and US\$3 000 (part-time) fee covers tuition only. Provision must be made for all other necessary expenses as set out in the guideline sections below. Students should take into account only those costs which are relevant to their studies at the University.

Research Masters and Doctoral Studies

The normal University of KwaZulu-Natal tuition fee for local students plus an international levy of R700 (2008) is charged per semester.

Study Abroad Students

The tuition fee for any international students taking one or more modules for non-degree purposes will be US\$880 per module per semester, inclusive of the international levy.

International Affiliates

Visiting international students (other than post-doctoral students) who are not registering for any modules but wish to be affiliated to the University of KwaZulu-Natal whilst pursuing their own research, or are here in any other capacity, will pay US\$150 per month.

On-campus Vacation Accommodation

Accommodation fees do not include residence fees during vacations. Accommodation during vacation is R45 – R50 per day.

For international students all tuition and residence fees due to the University are payable in advance prior to registration at the University of KwaZulu-Natal.

Provision for Additional Expenses

Students must take into account a range of expenses which they may have to meet, depending on their particular course of study. These may include:

- Orientation week
- Text materials (issued by the University)
- Field trips
- Books, stationery and equipment
- Transport (off-campus)
- Sports clubs and societies (optional)
- Pocket money

As a guideline a total amount of R14 000 (South African Rand) should be allowed for a full year's study to cover the above. Fees quoted are in South African Rands per annum. The cost to the student in the currency of origin shall vary from time to time, based on the prevailing exchange rate of the South African Rand.

Campus Health Clinics

Libraries

The five campuses of the University of KwaZulu-Natal have excellent library collections. Qualified subject librarians provide general reference and instructional services to students, staff and the wider community. The libraries are fully computerised and operate in a networked environment that provides access to the computerised catalogues and a range of local, national and international databases.

Edgewood Campus

The Edminson Library on the Edgewood campus serves the Faculty of Education.

Howard College

On the Howard College campus, the E G Malherbe library (main library) caters for a wide range of disciplines, including the Humanities, Social Sciences, Engineering and Science. In addition, the following branch libraries serve specialized academic needs:

- The G M J Sweeney Law Library in the Faculty of Law, Howard College.
- The Eleanor Bonnar Music Library in the School of Music, Howard College.
- The Barrie Biermann Architecture Library in the School of Architecture.

Nelson R Mandela School of Medicine

The Medical Library, situated at the Nelson R Mandela School of Medicine in Umbilo Road, caters for Health Sciences, as does the Victor Daitz HIV/Aids Information Gateway at the Doris Duke Medical Research Institute.

Pietermaritzburg

The Cecil Renaud Library (main library) serves the Humanities, Social Sciences, Commerce and Management disciplines, and the Sciences. The Law Library and the Life Sciences Library serve Law and the Biological Sciences respectively. The Life Sciences Library is one of the most important research collections for natural sciences in South Africa. There are also outlying collections of periodicals in the Schools of Physics and Chemistry. The Alan Paton Centre and Struggle Archives collects, preserves and conserves documents, manuscripts, papers, books, journals, tapes, videos, posters, artefacts and information on aspects of resistance to apartheid with a focus on the KwaZulu-Natal Midlands. Included is a major collection of Alan Paton's literary works and related documents and manuscripts, as well as papers pertaining to the Liberal Party and other political organisations.

The University Archives houses a collection of archival material relating to the University's history and the achievements of its staff and students. CATNIP is a network of over 26 libraries in the Pietermaritzburg region. The holdings of these libraries are included in the UKZN Library Catalogue (Pietermaritzburg). CATNIP members include the Natal Society Library, Natal Museum, Cedara Agricultural Institute, and members of the Theological Cluster.

Westville

The Westville Campus Library consists of the Main Library which is situated in B Block near the centre of campus and the Joe Ryan Dentistry Library which is located at the Dental Hospital. The library holds a large volume of books, journals and audiovisual materials in its

collections and in addition provides access to electronic resources including bibliographic and full-text databases, as well as links to academic and other resources on the internet. In close collaboration with Faculties, the branches of the University Library provide information services and access to an impressive collection of academic resources to support the learning, teaching, research and development endeavours of the University community.

Sports and Recreation

Sport is an important part of University life and the University caters for everyone – from the recreational through to the highly-competitive participants. Howard College, which has its own indoor sports complex, also offers gymnastics, surfing and badminton, while Pietermaritzburg also offers water-skiing, golf and boxing. The Westville campus boasts a well-equipped and modern indoor sports complex and an Olympic-size swimming pool.

The following sports are offered on the Westville campus: athletics, aerobics, badminton, basketball, boxing, ballroom dancing, chess, cricket, gymnastics, golf, hockey, karate, netball, soccer, softball, squash, swimming, table tennis, tenniquoite, volleyball and weightlifting. All sport is administered by the Sport Administration Office on each campus. University sport is affiliated to SASSU (South African Student Sports Union) and many opportunities are provided for competition at regional and national level, culminating in the World Student Games which are held biennially. Bursaries are available for top performers. Any student who is selected for provincial or national representation can apply to the Sports Administration for financial assistance.

Entrance Requirements

International Applicants

International applicants are subject to a selection procedure based on academic merit and the number of spaces available. The qualifications of applicants who obtained non-South African qualifications will be assessed as soon as we receive the applications and copies of certificates. Please ensure that you enclose certified copies of your original documents and arrange for official translations where applicable. Your original documents will be required at registration.

Study Permit Requirements

Prior to leaving for South Africa applicants must approach a South African Embassy, Consulate or Trade Office in their home country and obtain a study permit. In terms of current South African legislation, South African universities are not allowed to register international students who do not hold valid study visas. Study visas cannot be applied for in South Africa.

Study Permit Application Procedures

In terms of revised policy on the admission of international students it is imperative that students await the outcome of their applications for study permits in their countries of origin or residence. Study permits are renewed prior to expiry. It normally takes six weeks for study permit applications to be processed.

Where to go to apply for a study permit

You are required to apply for a study permit at the South African High Commission, Embassy, Consulate or Trade Mission in your country of origin. If there is no South African representative in your country, you must apply to the South African High Commission, Embassy, Consulate or Trade Mission nearest to your home country.

When do you apply for a study permit?

You may make an application for a Study Permit/Visa once you have received a letter from the University offering you a place to study together with a letter in support for an application for a study visa.

How do you apply for a study permit?

1. Collect the appropriate study permit application from the South African Embassy, Consulate, High Commission or Trade Mission in your country.
2. Complete and return the study permit application to the office where you collected the form initially together with:
 - A valid passport.
 - Our letter offering you a place.
 - Proof that you are financially in a position to pay tuition fees and have adequate means of support.

- A medical certificate as provided on the study permit application form and details of arrangements made with regard to medical or insurance cover.
- Repatriation guarantee: Where a South African sponsoring body, South African citizen or permanent resident of the country is not prepared to give a written undertaking as provided in the application form BI-159, you will be required to lodge a cash deposit or bank guarantee equivalent to airfare or transportation costs to your country of origin for repatriation purposes or forfeiture to the South African government should permit conditions not be complied with.
- The repatriation guarantee deposit should be paid by the student or the sponsor. The University does not accept responsibility for payment of repatriation guarantee deposits.
- Study permit application fee.

You are advised to submit the above documentation as soon as possible to the South African High Commission, Embassy, Consulate or Trade Mission. Do not send the above documents to the University of Kwa-Zulu-Natal. Please keep copies of all documentation submitted for your reference and future use.

Accommodation

Applications for residence accommodation should be made at the time of application. The Housing Offices assist students to find off-campus accommodation. The cost of

off-campus accommodation varies depending on location and facilities available. In this regard students should take into account the cost of transport to campus.

Financial Aid

Regrettably, financial aid is not available to international students. International students are advised to make enquiries from their Ministries of Education or Scholarship Offices at universities in their country of origin.

Refugee Applicants

You should be in possession of a valid Section 41 permit/Refugee identity document which grants you permission to study. Application procedures and application fees as for local students are applicable. When submitting an application please include:

- payment of the local application fee
- certified English translations of high school/university documents.

The Alliance Francaise assists with French to English translations. Please contact them to establish the cost.

Financing your studies

Scholarships administered by the United Nations High Commission for Refugees are limited and few students succeed in securing a scholarship. The few who do succeed in securing a scholarship should be willing to save and/or work during vacations to contribute to study expenses. Those who do not secure a scholarship may wish to consider less expensive study options

e.g. correspondence study which allows you to work full-time and to finance your own studies.

English Proficiency

The University of KwaZulu-Natal is an English medium university. Its policy on English language proficiency requires that applicants demonstrate at least one of the following levels of proficiency in English:

1. A pass in an examination equivalent to English at the Higher Grade (First or Second language) at South African Senior Certificate level (Matriculation).
2. A pass in English Language at A-level, or O-level (C symbol or higher), or the International Baccalaureate, or equivalent examination.
3. International applicants who do not satisfy the above and for whom English is a foreign language must attain an overall band score of 7.0 on the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) for postgraduate studies.

For information on the IELTS, contact the British Council at the British Embassy or consulate in your home country. The system tests the complete range of English language skills required by students when studying or training in the medium of English. Modules include listening, speaking, reading, writing, academic and general training. Please see www.britishcouncil.org or www.ielts.org for more information.

A test score of at least 550 on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). Contact the United States Information Service (USIS) at the USA embassy or consulate in your home country,

E-mail: toefl@ets.org Website: www.toefl.org The UKZN Language Centre offers students without a score an alternative route into the University by offering intensive English language instruction which is designed to raise competence levels to the required IELTS band score. Once registered in a degree programme, students may choose to continue taking English Language courses on a part-time basis. After testing by the Language Centre, students whose scores are comparable to the IELTS can move directly into a degree programme, or are advised to spend one or two semesters (at the most) learning English in the Language Centre. The LC test is designed to be facilitative rather than exclusionary.

Language Centre assessment for postgraduate studies

- Candidates who achieve a level equivalent to IELTS band 6 must take a one-year advanced course of 1 000 hours (Course Two) to be adequately equipped for postgraduate studies in the medium of English.
- Candidates who obtain the equivalent of IELTS band 5 are required to take a one-year intermediate course of 1 000 hours (Course Two) to raise their band level sufficiently for entry into a degree programme. Candidates who do not attain band 7 in one year are required to undertake a second year of study.

Students entering the Language Centre at level 5 are advised to budget adequately for

the time spent doing courses in English for academic purposes. Students are urged to make every attempt to gain a sufficient level of proficiency in English, and a test score, before arriving in South Africa.

Important notes

- The University is not permitted to register you until you have produced your study permit and proof of health insurance.
- You must present your passport with valid study permit and health insurance to the International Student Support Office during registration.
- Students who change their choice of institution should obtain a new permit from the Department of Home Affairs.
- An offer of a place to study at University

does not bind the Department of Home Affairs in any way to allow that person into the country, nor does it remove the need to obtain official permission from the Department.

- A study permit does not qualify an international student to become a South African citizen. Students wishing to become South African citizens after finishing their studies should go back to their home countries from where they can apply through a South African representative.

Health Care Insurance

International students are not entitled to receive free care at state and provincial facilities. Medical costs are high and therefore all international students need adequate insurance cover while in South Africa. The University has a policy of insurance which is limited to cover accidents only. All registered students both full and part-time are automatically covered by this personal accident insurance policy. Since the accident cover offered by the university policy is limited, your own personal insurance policy is essential to cover excess accident and other medical costs.

International students should hold health insurance cover from various companies both South African and from home. You may wish to contact health insurance companies of your choice to enquire about the costs and overall cover. It is important that the health cover that you purchase includes

hospitalisation cover. It is your choice to take extra cover for dentistry and optometry. When purchasing insurance in your home country, please ensure that the claim procedures are explained to you since several insurance companies require that you pay for treatment in South Africa and thereafter submit your claim to them. The University has chosen Ingwe Health Plan to provide hospital cover for students. Ingwe provides comprehensive cover for all medical costs incurred whilst an in-patient at a hospital. Claims are paid at 100% of the South African Representative Association of Medical Schemes (RAMS) tariff and no excesses or limitations apply.

Cover will run for the duration of the study period. The monthly cost of the cover increases annually and should be confirmed with Ingwe. Full contributions must be paid to Ingwe in advance. Cover also includes dentistry and optometry. The benefits for dentistry include conservative dentistry i.e. cleanings, fillings, extractions and fluoride treatment. The benefits for optometry includes single vision, bifocal lenses plus a frame.

Example:

If your study period is nine months, the contribution will be Rx (9 x Rx). (If your study period is cut short for any reason, contributions for the remaining period will be refunded, providing one month's advance notice is received). The full contribution is payable to Ingwe in advance. Cover is for the full duration of study i.e. nine months (Feb – Jun and Aug – Nov). If you intend remaining in South Africa for vacations, field trips or for research you are advised to take

cover for vacation periods.

Postgraduates with three to six months thesis submission time left to completing their studies should consult the International Student Support Office as it is possible to take cover for this period only.

Application forms are available directly from Ingwe at: Ingwe, Private Bag X137, Halfway House 1685. Enclose proof of payment with your application to Ingwe Health Plan.

On arrival students should contact the International Student Support Offices. Students who are able to provide proof of insurance, which would provide appropriate cover for them whilst in South Africa, will be exempted from membership of Ingwe, if such proof is provided to the International Support Office during registration.
